# The Why:

Youth spend the majority of their time in school

Prevention falls under the mandate to provide a safe learning environment for students

Increasing parent knowledge increases their comfort with the topic so they can effectively help their children

# WHAT WE KNOW ABOUT YOUTH SUICIDE - 9-12<sup>th</sup> grades (CDC, YOUTH RISK BEHAVIOR SURVEY, 2019 data)

Oklahoma Statistics: 16<sup>th</sup> in the nation in Suicide Deaths 2<sup>nd</sup> leading cause of death in ages 15-24

Broken Arrow Statistics: 2017: 28 deaths by suicide 3<sup>rd</sup> in the state behind OKC and Tulsa

- 37% felt so sad or hopeless every day for 2 weeks in a row that they stopped doing some usual activities
- **18.8**% seriously considered suicide
- 15.7% made a suicide plan
- 8.9% made one or more suicide attempts
- Leading cause of death among youth

# The What: Lifelines Prevention Goals

 To develop the schoolbased expertise and supports needed for responding to the problem of adolescent suicidal behavior

- 2 or 4 lessons
- Detailed lesson plans correlated to National Curriculum Standards
- Reviews in-school & community resources
- Designed to be taught by school staff
- Will be completed in Advisory classes.

## The How: Training Staff and Parents

#### **Staff Training**

- Staff has been trained in recognizing risk factors and warning signs.
- Staff has been given procedures on reporting or handling concerns about students at risk.
- Staff has been given all materials to present the classroom lessons.

#### **Parent Training**

- Districtwide Zoom training session was held for interested parents.
- Focus was on recognizing risk factors and warning signs as well as building resiliency in their children.
- Talk Saves Lives Training through Copes/Family and Children's Services

#### **Student Training**

- 2-4 Sessions
- Focus 6<sup>th</sup> grade =
   understanding the seriousness
   of suicide, how to help
   friends, and asking for help
   takes courage.
- Focus 7<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup> grades = recognizing when your friend is in trouble, how to help, and where to go for help.
- Focus 11<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grades =
   Transitions after high school/looking toward the future and how to handle when reality doesn't measure up.

# Middle School Implementation

- ☐Staff training
- ☐Students were given a pretest
- using a variety of delivery methods specific to each middle school.
- ☐4 lessons for each grade level
- ☐Students will be given a post test to measure growth of knowledge and comfort with the topic.

#### **High School Implementation**

- ☐Staff training
- ☐Students were given a pretest
- ☐Student lessons are taught through advisory.
- □2020-21 all grades will have 4 lessons (4 weeks of sessions).
- ☐Students will be given a post test to measure growth of knowledge and comfort with the topic.
